International Violin Competition of Indianapolis Announces its 2019-2020 Laureate Series

INDIANAPOLIS – The International Violin Competition of Indianapolis (IVCI) is pleased to announce its 2019-2020 Season, which will feature six of its Laureates: Gold Medalists **Kyoko Takezawa** (1986) and **Pavel Berman** (1990); Silver Medalist **Tessa Lark** (2014); and Bronze Medalists **Andrés Cárdenes** (1986), **Soovin Kim** (2002) and **Luke Hsu** (2018). They will be joined by Indiana-based ensembles including the Indianapolis Chamber Orchestra (November 23), the Ronen Chamber Ensemble (January 28), the Jacobs School of Music String Academy Virtuosi (February 16), plus long-time IVCI pianist Chih-Yi Chen (February 16 and March 24). Back by popular demand, the DePue Brothers Band will return December 13 for their Bluegrass Family Christmas program, and Tessa Lark reprises her sensational *Hot Swing: Gypsy Jazz* with bassist Michael Thurber on May 12. In 2020, the IVCI will feature a three-concert celebration featuring works by Beethoven will take place mid-season, honoring the 250th anniversary of the composer's birth (February 16, March 24 and April 16).

Performances will be held in popular venues across Indianapolis including the **Schrott Center for the Performing Arts** at Butler University (610 W 46th Street), **The Cabaret** (924 N Pennsylvania Street), the Cook Theater and Grand Hall at **Indiana Landmarks** (1201 Central Avenue) and the **Indiana History Center** (450 W Ohio Street).

School of Music String Academy Virtuosi. Equally talented as a composer, Hsu will give the world premiere performance of his new work, written especially for this recital. This performance will also feature the Sonata No. 8 in G, Op. 30 by Beethoven, the first of several works by Beethoven in the 2019/2020 Season celebrating the 250th anniversary of this composer's birth in 1770.

Heroic Saint-Saëns and Beethoven with 1986 Gold Medalist Kyoko Takezawa

1986 Gold Medalist **Kyoko Takezawa** showcases a noble side of Saint-Saëns, who drew inspiration for his first violin sonata from Beethoven. Combined with Chopin's beloved Nocturne in D-flat and Bloch's lyrical *Baal Shem* Suite, Takezawa and pianist Chih-Yi Chen delight in this inspirationally heroic program. Continuing the Beethoven 250th Celebration, Takezawa and Chen will perform Beethoven's sensual Sonata No. 10 in G, Op. 96.

Forces of Nature: Beethoven and Jalbert with the Chien-Kim-Watkins Trio

Beethoven was known to find inspiration strolling through the German and Austrian countrysides, saturating his music with the love of nature. 2002 Bronze Medalist **Soovin Kim** along with pianist Gloria Chien and cellist Paul Watkins (of the Emerson Trio) present two of Beethoven's most celebrated trios, drawing to a close the 2019-2020 Beethoven Celebration. The nature-inspired Trio No. 2 by American composer Pierre Jalbert elegantly juxtaposes the two trios of Beethoven.
